Turkey Earthquake Response





Samaritan's Purse is on the ground in Turkey providing emergency aid to survivors of the deadly earthquakes that occurred in early February. Nearly 100 of our disaster response specialists are working alongside local partners to meet physical and spiritual needs.

Since February 13, our Emergency Field Hospital has been providing inpatient and outpatient care—as well as performing surgeries—to fill a critical gap in medical services. Our mobile medical facility is located in a town near Antakya, adjacent to the non-operational Hatay State Hospital that was irreparably crippled by the earthquakes.

Our teams and partners are also working diligently to provide and assemble tent shelters for 7,000 displaced families, as well as distributing supply kits that include mattresses, pillows, sheets, blankets, solar lights, and hygiene kits. These supplies and temporary accommodations are meeting the urgent needs of people facing homelessness in the wake of total destruction.

A recent airlift also delivered water and sanitation equipment—including four freshwater treatment systems—additional family tents, and medical supplies.

Please pray for the people who are suffering in Turkey, and for our team on the ground as they continue to faithfully serve in these challenging conditions in Jesus' Name.
